



ASEPAC is excited to partner with Wamsutta Middle School to bring an Ability Awareness Event to all 5th graders. Our goal is to promote awareness, acceptance and inclusion among all students. This event is a hands-on experiential learning opportunity, which will allow students a glimpse into what it is like to perform different kinds of tasks at school with different kinds of disabilities. There will be different learning stations with different activities at each station. This is an exciting opportunity for parent volunteers to work directly with students during the hands on activities. The Ability Awareness Event is scheduled for Friday May 18th with set-up at 11:20am and the event starting at 12:20pm. We expected the event to last until 2:10pm.

Learning stations will include activities that will focus on these disabilities: Vision, Deaf/Hard of Hearing, Physical, Intellectual, Learning and Autism/Asperger's. In order to make this event successful we are looking for parent volunteers. If you would be interested in participating you would need to have an updated CORI form on file at Wamsutta Middle School (if you have a CORI on file at another school in the district we would still need for you to complete one at Wamsutta at least 1 week prior to the event). We will also have CORI forms available at our April 25th meeting which will be held in the Wamsutta library.
